The annual Cambridge Jazz Festival returns for its 10th edition, showcasing a wealth of local and global talent alongside a celebration of Jazz icons for two weeks in November. Headliners include 20 x Grammy-award winning guitarist and composer Pat Metheny (Saffron Hall, Nov 17), Grammy-award winning saxophonist Tim Garland and his Lighthouse Trio & Britten Sinfonia (West Road Concert Hall, Nov 20), Brand New Heavies celebrating the 30th anniversary of the 'Brother Sister' album (Corn Exchange Nov 8), OMAR & QCBA (Cambridge Junction Nov 16), award winning guitarist Rob Luft Quartet & Amika String Quartet (Cambridge Junction, Nov 23) and many others.

We are also deeply honoured to have the multi-award winning trombonist and composer Dennis Rollins MBE as our Artist-In-Residence and you can catch Dennis at two very different events (see below). We also welcome back the legendary Gina Southgate as Artist-In-Residence. Gina will be live painting a number of key events, exhibiting her work at Storey's Field Centre and she'll also be running a workshop!

Our full programme is a celebration of Jazz in every form, from modern, be-pop, electronic, rock, funk to soul, concerts, recitals, family sessions for all ages, choir events, community days celebrating Big Band and Latin jazz, instrumental and vocal workshops, jam sessions throughout and an extensive fringe programme. Artists in Residence

Dennis Rollins MBE

Cambridge Jazz Festival are proud to welcome multi-award-winning composer and trombonist, Dennis Rollins MBE as Artist in Residence this year. Rollins is set to appear at two events: Dennis Rollins & CUJO on Nov 17 (West Road Concert Hall) featuring a set list of cutting-edge Iain Dixon big band arrangements from Dennis' Velocity Trio Album 'The 11th Gate' (2011), and with Cambridge's Zero Gravity Trio at La Raza on Nov 14.

For over 25 years, trombonist Dennis Rollins has played at the forefront of UK jazz, funk and pop as an 'impossibly virtuosic' sideman to such stars such as Maceo Parker, Pee Wee Ellis, Courtney Pine, The Brand New Heavies, Blur, Monty Alexander and as an award-winning leader in his own right. He was also a previous winner of the BBC Jazz 'Best Band' Award, the Parliamentary Jazz 'Education' Award; Ronnie Scott's 'Best Trombone' Award among others.





Gina Southgate

We are delighted to welcome back the legendary Gina Southgate as this year's Cambridge Jazz Festival Visual Artist-in-Residence. Gina will be live painting at a number of key live music events at the Festival, exhibiting her work at Storey's Field Centre (Nov 8 – Dec 5) and she'll also be running a painting workshop (Nov 23)!

'My live painting is concerned with the essence of the moment and my alignment to that moment. A musician's unique relationship with their instrument informs my visual response'

Gina Southgate is a live painter, best known on the UK's international jazz scene where she produces spectacular, qualitative, real time paintings. For three decades she's painted at gigs and festivals capturing the vitality and nuance in her unique portraits of world class musicians. Her original paintings and limited edition prints hang in public and private collections worldwide.



Released in 1994, The Brand New Heavies' third album 'Brother Sister' changed everything for the band. Propelled by the classic singles 'Dream On Dreamer', 'Midnight At The Oasis' and 'Back To Love', the record achieved huge success (a #4 chart position, over a million sales and a BRIT nomination) as they cemented their position as the pioneers of Acid Jazz.

Featuring original members Andrew Levy and Simon Bartholomew with the phenomenal vocalist Angela Ricci, the tour will see The Brand New Heavies perform 'Brother Sister' in full alongside other hits and fan favourites from their storied history with a complete live band.


WORKSHOP: Jazz Improvisation with Martin Shaw Cambridge Jazz Co-op

With his celebrated septet, he pays tribute to one of his instrument's great heroes - the legendary Benny Goodman, international jazz superstar from the Golden Age of Swing and - like Bliss - a master at switching seamlessly between jazz and classical worlds.

Tonight it is swing all the way. Bliss and his band feature classic standards made famous by Benny Goodman and his Rhythm Makers in the 1930s - I Would do Most Anything for You, Don't Be Stompin' That Way and Al Jolson's Avalon, alongside some unforgettable George Gershwin hits – Summertime and I Got Rhythm among them. With new and exciting arrangements, The Julian Bliss Septet bring a 2020s twist to the great tunes of the swing era with style, verve and affection.

Set amongst the dive bars and jazz jook joints of London's Soho, we hear about the desperate hand-to-mouth finances of the early years and the frequent police raids. We hear how Ronnie's became neutral ground within rife gang territory and their scrapes with gangsters including the Krays who were rumoured to have taken Ronnie and Pete "for a little drive"! Life at Ronnie's is evocatively reimagined through tales of the club's past visitors, from pop stars, film stars and politicians to comedians and royalty, but above all, the musicians...

Mixing classic music from the jazz greats who have performed at Ronnie Scott's over its incredible 65 year history, alongside tales of old Soho, miscreant musicians and police raids, this is a unique evening celebrating one of the world's most famous jazz venues, its music, and history.



Driven by drummer **Tim Cook** (TC) and fronted by Sheffield wordsmith **Franz Von**, their live shows are powerful and dynamic, creating moments of both euphoria and stillness to keep audiences on their toes. Originally formed in Leeds, their sound reflects the diverse musical and cultural backgrounds at the core of the project, with songs exploring grooves and genres including afrobeat, broken beat, jungle, jazz and grime.

The band have performed at the BBC Introducing stage at Latitude 2024 and have supported the likes of K.O.G, Nubiyan Twist and Yussef Dayes. They're en route to becoming one of the most sought after live acts on the UK jazz circuit with notable festival performances (Glastonbury, We Out Here, Greenman, Boomtown and WOMAD) and sold out shows.



20 times Grammy award-winning guitarist & composer Pat Metheny is launching a solo tour to coincide with the release of his new album MoonDial, to be released on BMG July 26th; a follow up to the 2023 Grammy Nominated solo album Dream Box.

The tour, a first of its kind for Metheny, will feature personal and fan favourites from his nearly 50 year career.





Pat says "[Last fall's tour] represented not just the sound and vibe of the Dream Box release, but really was an opportunity for me to look at all the other ways I have released records and done occasional performances in a solo setting across the years. Each one of those solo recordings, and Dream Box as well, are unlike the others. The idea for me is to try to keep coming up with different angles and ways of thinking about music while hopefully keeping a fundamental aesthetic at work in all of it. In other words, to continue the research."

Metheny has already produced a catalogue of 50-plus recordings that have scored 39 Grammy nominations and 20 wins in twelve different categories. Measured in terms of influence, this catalogue is in a class by itself. New Chautauqua from 1979 almost singlehandedly defined an era of instrumental steel-stringed Americana that spawned legions of imitators. Zero Tolerance For Silence pushed the boundaries of modern music-making once again, and served as a companion piece to the Grammy-winning disc Secret Story. The Orchestrion Project – for which Metheny wrote the music and built a series of instruments to be controlled by his guitar, recording the results both in the studio and in a live concert – was so new in conception and execution that even a decade-plus later, it stands apart from any previous ideas of what a solo performer might achieve alone onstage.

CUJO's collaboration with Dennis Rollins MBE will feature a set list of cutting-edge Iain Dixon big band arrangements from Dennis' Velocity Trio Album 'The 11th Gate' (2011).

Dennis Rollins MBE is well-known on the British and international jazz scene and is celebrated for his versatility and muscular approach to playing the trombone. Born in 1964 to Jamaican parents, Dennis cut his teeth at the age of 14, studying in brass bands and an extended spell under tutorship at the Doncaster Youth Jazz Association. After studying he moved to London where he joined the National Youth Jazz Orchestra (NYJO) and legendary all-black jazz big band, The lazz Warriors.

Over the years he has established a reputation as an artist of excellence and has lent his unique and stylish talents to some of the world's top jazz and pop personalities including Maceo Parker, Pee Wee Ellis, Courtney Pine, Baba Maal, Jamiroquai, US3, Brand New Heavies, and Blur.

In 2006 his jazz/funk ensemble, Badbone & Co won the prestigious BBC Jazz Award for Best Band and later picked up Trombonist of the Year at both the British Jazz Awards, and the Ronnie Scott's Jazz Awards.

Dennis was nominated twice in the 2008 Parliamentary Jazz Awards for Jazz Musician of the Year and the Jazz Education Award; he won the latter.

In February 2008, Dennis was given Honorary Freedom of the Borough in recognition of his successful musical career and for his role as an inspiration to Doncaster's (UK) musical youth.

As part of Her Majesty the Queen's Birthday Honours 2018, Dennis was honoured with an MBE for services to music.
